Our therapists work to supportively empower their clients, providing restoration and hope in often the very darkest hours of their lives.

Employee Wellness Center is an employee assistance program (EAP) that contracts with local businesses to ensure their employees and family members receive emotional health support through counseling and coaching. We also offer our contracts the opportunity for presentations, debriefings, trainings and information to meet the needs of their staff.

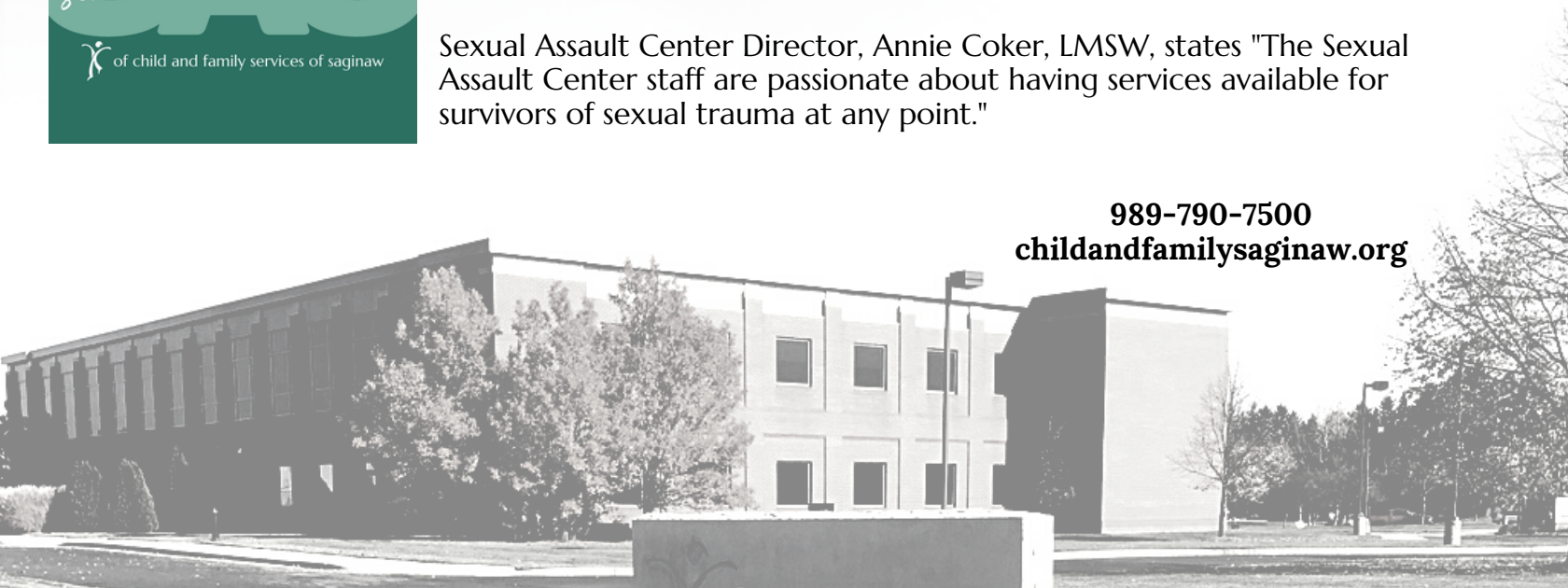

We are happy to work as a community, encouraging mental health services in venues which reduce barriers and are relevant to the needs among us.

Looking ahead for 2022, expansion of services to meet the critical need for substance abuse counseling is on Child & Family Service's agenda. We also are excited to market the evidence-based therapeutic skills in EFT, Motivational Interviewing and EMDR that our competent, compassionate clinicians have to offer their clients, beyond traditional talk therapy.

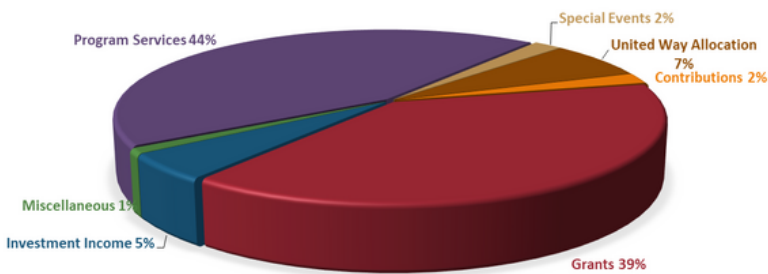

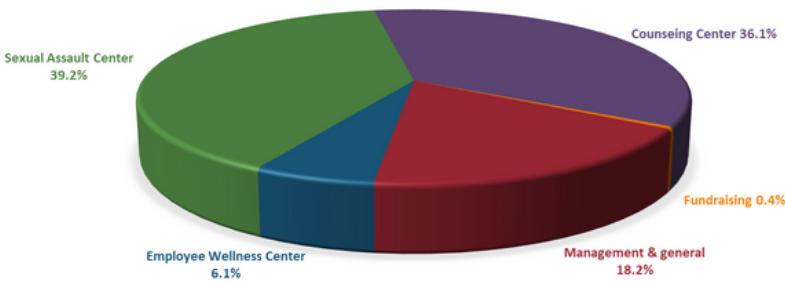
